

Know all men by these Presents, That we, Susan P. Butters and Eleanor P. Butters
 Butters, of Lowell, County of Middlesex, Commonwealth of Massachusetts,
 and George S. Butters of Barre, County of Worcester, and said Common-
 wealth, being the heirs of the late George S. Butters except Charles S. Butters,
 who has quitclaimed to us his interest in consideration of One Thousand
 Dollars, to us paid by Abel J. Atherton, of said Lowell, the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and con-
 vey unto the said Abel J. Atherton, his heirs and assigns, a certain lot
 of land situated in said Lowell on the Eastward side of Fairmount
 Street, thus bounded and described, viz: Beginning at the South
 westerly corner of the lot of land, now or formerly of Erne Wing, thence
 running Eastward along said Wing's land five hundred and two feet, to
 land now or formerly of one Wayman; thence Southward along said Way-
 man land one hundred fifty two and $\frac{1}{2}$ feet to land formerly of one
 Sheppard, now of one Quant; thence Westward along said Quant land
 five hundred forty one $\frac{1}{2}$ feet to said Fairmount Street; thence Northward
 along said Fairmount street one hundred seventy five feet to the point
 of beginning, Being part of the same premises conveyed by Reuben A.
 Upton to George S. Butters, Also the first-described tract in a mortgage
 from the said Upton to Jacob Kelley dated October 1st A.D. 1855. Also
 the first-described lot of land in a deed from Thomas Keenith to said
 Upton, dated May 26th A.D. 1852, and recorded in the Middlesex South
 District Registry of Deeds, Book 632, Page 359. The said premises
 being deeded under the express agreement and condition, that the
 land shall never be deeded or conveyed to any person born in Ireland.

 grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Susan B. Butters, a cer-

 A. P. Bonney mount street, thus bounded and described, viz: Beginning at the South-

 Page 168 running Easterly along said Wong's land five hundred and two feet
 to land now or formerly of one Wyman; thence Southerly along said
 Wyman land one hundred fifty two $\frac{1}{2}$ feet to land formerly of one
 Shippard, now of one Quant; thence Westerly along said Quant land
 five hundred forty one $\frac{5}{8}$ feet to said Fairmount street; thence Northerly

 said Susan B. Butters and others, of even date and delivered simultaneous-
 ly herewith, To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the priv-
 ilages and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said Susan B. Butters
 and her heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever. And I
 do hereby, for myself and my heirs, executors and administrators, covenant with
 the said grantee and her heirs and assigns that I am lawfully seized in fee
 simple of the granted premises, that they are free from all incumbrances,
 that I have good right to sell and convey the same as aforesaid; and that I
 will and my heirs, executors, and administrators shall warrant and defend
 the same to the said grantee and her heirs and assigns forever against
 the lawful claims and demands of all persons. Provided nevertheless, that if I
 or my heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, shall pay unto the grantee, or
 her executors, administrators or assigns, the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred
 Dollars in equal annual payments of Five Hundred Dollars each, the whole
 to be paid in five years from this date, with interest semi-annually at the
 rate of six per cent per annum, and until such payment shall be paid all
 taxes and assessments on the granted premises; and shall not commit or suf-
 fer any stop or waste of the granted premises, or any breach of any covenant
