

Whereas we the Sagamores of Penicook  
 Pentucket Squamequot and Muchan-anack are in-  
 clined to have an English inhabit amongst us  
 as they are amongst our Country men in the New  
 Sachmetto Bay by which means we hope in time  
 to be strengthened against our Enemies the Tartens  
 who yearly doth us Damage likewise being per-  
 suaded that it will be for the good of us  
 and our Posterity &c To that end have at a  
 general meeting at Squamsquot on Pinataqua River  
 we the aforesaid Sagamores with universal consent  
 of our Subjects do covenant and agree with the  
 English as followeth ~ Now Com<sup>o</sup> all men by  
 these Presents that we Passaconaway Sagamore of

Penicook Kunaaritt Sagamore & Pentuckitt Wahany  
 nonaritt Sagamore of Squomsquot and Rowes Sag-  
 amore of Nucharwanack for a Comptent valuation  
 in goods already received in Coats Shirts and vict-  
 uals and also for the Consideration aforesaid do  
 according to the Limits and Bounds hereafter  
 granted give grant Bargain Sell release ratifie and  
 confirm unto John Wheelwright of the Massachusetts  
 Bay late of England a minister of the Gospel  
 Augustine Story Thomas White William Wentworth and  
 Thomas Lever all of the Massachusetts Bay in  
 New England to them their Heirs and assigns for-  
 ever all that Part of the main Land bounded by  
 the River of Piscattaqua and the River of Merem-  
 ack that is to say to begin at Nucharwanack  
 Falls in Piscattaqua River aforesaid and so down  
 said River to the Sea and so alongst the Sea  
 shore to Meremack River and so up along said  
 River to the Falls at Pentuckit aforesaid and  
 from said Pentuckit Falls upon a Northwest Line  
 Twenty English miles into the woods and from  
 thence to run on a Strait Line northeast and  
 South west till meet with the main Rivers that  
 runs down to Pentuckit Falls and Nucharwanack  
 Falls and the Rivers to be the Bounds of the  
 said Lands from the Thwart Line or head Line  
 of the aforesaid Falls and the main Channel of  
 each River from Pentuckit and Nucharwanack Fall  
 to the main Sea to be the side Bounds and the  
 main Sea between Piscattaqua River and Meremack  
 River to be the lower Bounds and the Thwart  
 Line that runs from River to River to be  
 the upper Bounds Together with all Islands with-  
 in said Bounds as also the Isles of Shoals so  
 called by the English Together with all Profits  
 advantages and appurtes whatsoever to the said  
 Tract of Land belonging or in any ways ap-  
 pertaining reserving to our selves Liberty of  
 making use of our own planting Land as  
 also free Liberty of Hunting Fishing & Fowling  
 And it is likewise with them their Heirs and assigns

first that the said John Wheelwright shall  
 within few years after the date hereof set down  
 with a Company of English and begin a Plan-  
 tation at Squamequot Falls in Piscataqua River  
 aforesaid. Secondly that what other Inhabitants shall  
 come and live on said Tract of Land amongst  
 them from time to time and at all times  
 shall have and enjoy the same Benefits as the  
 said Wheelwright aforesaid. By that if at any time  
 there be a number of People amongst them that  
 have a mind to begin a New Plantation that  
 they be encouraged so to do & that no Planta-  
 tion exceed in Lands above ten English miles  
 Square or such a Proportion as amounts to ten  
 miles Square. Fourthly that the aforesaid granted  
 Lands are to be divided into Townships as People  
 increase and appear to inhabit them and that  
 no Lands shall be granted to any Particular Per-  
 sons but what shall be for a Township and what  
 Lands within Township is granted to any Particular  
 Persons to be by vote of the major Part of the  
 Inhabitants legally and orderly called in said  
 Township. Fifthly for managing and regulating and  
 for avoiding Contentions amongst them they are  
 to be under the Government of the Colony of  
 the Massachusetts their Neighbours and to observe  
 their Laws and orders until they have a  
 settled Government amongst themselves. Sixthly  
 we the aforesaid Sagamores and our Subjects  
 are to have free Liberty within the aforesaid  
 granted Tract of Land of Fishing Fowling Hunt-  
 ing and Planting &c. Seventhly and lastly in  
 every Township within the aforesaid Limits or  
 Tract of Land that hereafter shall pay to  
 Passacaway our chief Sagamore that now is  
 and to his Successors forever if lawfully de-  
 manded one Coat of Trucking Cloth a year  
 and every year for an acknowledgement and  
 also shall pay to Mr John Wheelwright aforesaid  
 his Heirs and Successors forever if lawfully de-  
 manded Two Bushels of Indian Corn a year

for and in consideration of said Wheelwright's  
 pains and care as also for the charges he hath  
 been at to obtain this our Grant for him  
 self and those aforementioned and the Inhabi-  
 tants that shall hereafter settle in Townships  
 on the aforementioned Premises and we the afore-  
 said Sagamores Passaconaway Sagamore of Pen-  
 neck Rumanawitt Sagamore of Pentucket Wa-  
 hanamawitt Sagamore of Squamsquot and Rowles  
 Sagamore of Muckawanack do by these Presents  
 ratify and confirm all the afore granted and  
 bargained Premises and tract of Land aforesaid  
 Excepting and reserving as afore expressed and re-  
 served and Proviso aforesaid fulfilled with all  
 the meadow and marsh ground therein together  
 with all the mines Minerals of what kind or  
 nature soever with all the woods Timber and Tim-  
 ber Trees Ponds Rivers Leakes Runns of Water or  
 Water Courses thereunto belonging with all the  
 freedom of fishing Fowling and Hunting as  
 our selves with all other Benefits Profits Privi-  
 ledges and appurtenances thereunto of all and  
 any part of the said Tract of Land belong-  
 ing or in any way appertaining unto him  
 the said John Wheelwright Augustine Storer Thom-  
 as Wright William Wentworth & Thomas Levet and  
 their Heirs forever as aforesaid To have and to  
 hold the same as their own proper Right and  
 Interest without the least Disturbance Mole-  
 station or Trouble of us our Heirs Exec<sup>rs</sup> and  
 adm<sup>rs</sup> to and with the said John Wheelwright  
 Augustine Storer Thomas Wright William Wentworth  
 and Tho<sup>s</sup> Levet their Heirs Exec<sup>rs</sup> adm<sup>rs</sup> and as-  
 signs and other English that shall inhabit there  
 and their Heirs and assigns forever shall War-  
 rant maintain & defend In Witness whereof we  
 have hereunto set our hands and seals the  
 seventeenth day of May 1629 and in the fourth  
 year of King Charles's Reign over England &c.



 of Saco Thomas Wiggan agent and Edward Hilton  
 Steward of the Plantation of Hiltons Point and  
 was signed sealed and delivered in our Presence  
 In Witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands  
 ye day & year above written

Articles of Agreement indentured and  
 made the Twentieth day of February in the  
 Seventh year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord  
 King George Annoque Dom one Thousand Seven  
 hundred and Twenty Between John Fay of Charles
